Small Group Study Guide: Exodus Week of November 12 (Week 10) Exodus 25-27



### **Sermon Overview**

Exodus 25–27 is easily overlooked as mundane instructions of an ancient building project. In truth, these verses layout detailed instructions for the most significant building ever constructed. The people of Israel knew very little about interacting with God. Just a few months earlier, the law was given to Moses at Mt. Sinai (Exodus 19–24). Before that, God's people were unaccustomed to and essentially ignorant when it came to interacting with God in any way. Understood in this context, every detail of God's instructions for the tabernacle revealed something about his character, nature and plan of redemption never known before.

The tabernacle gave God's people a revolutionary understanding of their sin and God's holiness, and pointed them toward a greater way of dwelling with God — a day when God would come down and dwell with his people in Jesus Christ, the "greater and more perfect tabernacle." (Hebrews 9:11)

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#### **Getting Started**

When you bring home a product that has "some assembly required," are you the type of person that pours over the instructions or tosses them in the trash? How would you have reacted as a part of the Israelite work crew following God's directions for assembly of the tabernacle?

  - c. The bread of presence (see John 6:32-33, 52-58):
  - d. The lampstand (John 1:4-5; 3:19-21):
  - e. The bronze wash basin (see 1 Corinthians 6:11; Titus 3:5):
  - f. Sacrifices offered (see Hebrews 9:12-14; 10:11-12):
