Small Group Study Guide: Mark Week of November 18 (Week 14) Mark 5:1-20



## **Sermon Overview**

Jesus has just calmed a violent storm at sea (4:35-41); he now meets a man with an equally violent storm inside him. In both cases, the power of Jesus prevails over chaos and destruction. The purpose of the healing of the Gerasene demoniac, as with the stilling of the storm on the lake, is not simply to leave readers awestruck at Jesus' power, however, but to prompt them to consider "how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you'" (5:19). Once again Jesus is connoted with God, for the Lord who has healed the demoniac is none other than Jesus (v. 20).

2. Read and compare Mark 5:15 and Mark 4:41. What similarities do you see in these verses and what does that tell you about the nature of Jesus?

4.	What does this same passage tell you about trusting/having faith in Jesus?

His soul is owned by teams of demons and he is a constant physical threat to himself and others. The power of Jesus made all these things instantly untrue.
