BRIARCLIFF CHURCH Small Group Study Guide: Mark Week of February 24 (Week 23) Mark 10:1-52



Sermon Overview

The material in chapter 10 is set in Jesus' journey through Judea. In addition to bringing Jesus and the disciples to Jerusalem, the journey also symbolizes the theme of discipleship. As Jesus nears Jerusalem, his teaching about his mission and the claims of discipleship become increasingly specific. Chapter 10 begins with the call to discipleship in the most fundamental aspects of life – marriage (vv. 1-12), children (vv. 13-16), and possessions (vv. 17-31). For a third time Jesus foretells his death and resurrection, and like his teaching on discipleship itself, the prediction is the most explicit yet (vv. 32-34). For the first time Jesus declares the servant-role of the Son of Man "not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (v. 45). Mark concludes the chapter with the healing of Bartimaeus, whose trust in Jesus for the recovery of his sight and following of Jesus "on the way" to Jerusalem represent the quintessence of discipleship (v. 52).1

2. Does Jesus give a "liberal" or "conservative" answer to the divorce question?

3. In verses 10-12, is Jesus overruling Moses and changing the Old Testament ruling on divorce?

4. According to Mark 10:13-16, what does it mean to receive the kingdom of God as a little child?

5. Why are Jesus' answers to the rich young man so unexpected, in light of verses 13-16 and the rest of Mark's gospel?

6. Why would Jesus "send away sad" someone who filled him with love (v. 21)?

7. What does Jesus teach about wealth in verses 23-31? Why do you think riches are such a spiritual snare? What is Jesus promising in 29-31 and how can we "lose" and "gain" some of these things today?

8. Read 2 Corinthians 8:9. You know something the rich young man did not. How can this make Jesus' call to us a joy?

9. There is a theme running through all three passages. What do all these passages tell us about entering the kingdom of God?
